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Work and Covid-19: what are the rules?

Verified 24 janvier 2022 - Legal and Administrative Information Directorate (Prime Minister)

Specific provisions are put in place due to the health crisis related to the Covid-19 pandemic. These provisions vary depending on whether you are a private employee or a public servant.

You're salaried

Telework or Present

You telework at least 3 days a week if your job allows it.

As of 2 February 2022, the use of teleworking will no longer be mandatory but will remain recommended.

Your employer must apply [national protocol to ensure the health and safety of employees in company](#) [application/pdf - 1.0 MB]  (<https://travail-emploi.gouv.fr/IMG/pdf/protocole-nationale-sante-securite-en-entreprise.pdf>).

Protective measures are issued by your employer by memorandum. They can be integrated into the rules and regulations of your company.

A Covid-19 reference is designated. In small companies, the referent can be the leader. The Covid-19 referent ensures the implementation of the defined measures and the information of the employees. Its identity and mission shall be communicated to all staff.

Vaccine Pass Required

What is the vaccine pass?

Depending on your activity, you must have one of the following documents:

- Vaccination certification that you have completed the [full vaccination scheme](#)  (<https://solidarites-sante.gouv.fr/grands-dossiers/vaccin-covid-19/je-suis-un-particulier/dose-de-rappel-covid19>)
- Certificate of reinstatement of more than 11 days and less than 6 months
- Certificate of contraindication to vaccination

These documents can be presented in paper or digital format, on the application « *AllAntiCovid* ».

The health care professional who carries out the vaccine recall will give you a vaccination certificate.

You can also download and print your certificate on the Health Insurance website.

You can save your vaccination certificate on the application *AllAntiCovid* scanning the QR code on the paper document.

Until 15 February 2022, you can use a negative test certificate of less than 24 hours if you have received a 1^{re} vaccine dose and are waiting for 2^e dose.

The health professional who conducts the screening test captures the result in the Covid-19 National Population Screening Information System (*SI-DEP*) and gives you the proof that you are negative or reinstated.

You also receive an email or an SMS that allows you, if necessary, to retrieve the result of your test on the [SI-DEP portal](#)  (<https://sidep.gouv.fr/cyberlab/patientviewer.jsp>).

You can save your test result to the application *AllAntiCovid* by scanning the QR code on the result document submitted by the healthcare professional or obtained on the SI-DEP portal.

 **Please note** : the wearing of the mask is mandatory in all establishments receiving the public and in enclosed places, including those subject to the vaccination pass.

Which professionals are involved?

Employees subject to the vaccination pass are those engaged in the following activities:

- Transport of persons
- Cultural, sports, fun or festive activities
- Commercial catering or beverage delivery (except collective catering, takeaway of prepared meals and professional road and rail catering)
- Fairs, seminars and trade shows
- Department stores and shopping centres (by decision of the prefect)

If your job is affected by the mandatory vaccination pass, you do not have one of these documents and you do not choose, in agreement with your employer, to leave, your employment contract is suspended. You're no longer paid. This suspension ends as soon as you present one of these 3 supporting documents.

Vaccination required

Health care professionals must be vaccinated against Covid-19, except for medical certificates of contraindication.

You are concerned if you work in one of the following establishments:

- Private Health Facility
- Health Centre
- Health home
- Mobile Care Centre and Team
- Support mechanism for the coordination of health pathways
- Tuberculosis Control Centre
- Free centre for information, screening and diagnosis of human immunodeficiency virus, viral hepatitis and sexually transmitted infections
- Occupational Health Service
- Establishment and social and medico-social service (Ehpad (), home ofAse (), etc.)
- Housing
- Residence-services for the elderly or disabled
- Inclusive Habitat

You are also affected if you do any of the following:

- Home Care Worker
- Member of an approved civil security association
- Ambulance
- Service provider and distributor of medical devices
- A health professional who practices as a liberal (including a psychologist, osteopath, chiropractor or psychotherapist)
- Medical student

You must have one of the following 3 documents to continue working:

- Proof that you received 2 doses of vaccine
- Certificate of Recovery from Covid-19 Contamination Issued on Presentation of a Positive Test for RT-PCR or an Antigenic Test More Than 11 Days Old and Less Than 6 Months Old
- Medical Certificate of Vaccine Counterindication

If you work in a health, social or medical-social institution, you must provide your employer or work physician with proof of your situation.

If you are one of the other professionals involved in the vaccine obligation, these are the [CPAM \(\)](#) inform [ARS \(\)](#) your vaccination status.

If you do not have one of the required documents, your employer will inform you without delay of your prohibition and of the means to regularise your situation. With the agreement of your employer, you can take leave. Otherwise, your employment contract is suspended and you are no longer paid.

The contract suspension ends as soon as you provide one of the required documents.

The period of suspension of your employment contract is not considered an effective period of work for the calculation of your leave entitlements. It is not taken into account in the calculation of your seniority and the resulting rights.

During this suspension, you retain the benefit of the additional social protection guarantees you have subscribed to.

If you [CDD \(\)](#), your contract expires on the scheduled date if it occurs during the suspension period.

You are considered vulnerable

You can be placed in unemployment (<https://www.service-public.fr/particuliers/vosdroits/F13898?lang=en>) if the following 3 conditions are met:

- Your workstation can expose you to high viral densities
- You cannot benefit from enhanced protection measures
- Your attending physician will issue you an isolation certificate to your employer that confirms that you are in a medical situation of vulnerability

You are in a medical situation of vulnerability if you are in one of the following situations:

- Be 65 years and older
- Have cardiovascular history (ATCD): complicated high blood pressure (with cardiac, renal and vasculocerebral complications), stroke or coronary artery disease, heart surgery, heart failure stage NYHA III or IV
- Have unbalanced or complicated diabetes
- Present a chronic respiratory condition that may be uncompensable during viral infection: broncho obstructive pulmonary disease, severe asthma, pulmonary fibrosis, sleep apnea syndrome, cystic fibrosis
- Present chronic renal failure with dialysis
- Being diagnosed with an evolutionary cancer under treatment (excluding hormone therapy)
- Obesity (body mass index > 30 kgm²)
- Have cirrhosis at stage B of Child Pugh's score at least
- Have major sickle cell syndrome or a history of splenectomy
- Be in 3rd trimester of pregnancy
- Have motor neurone disease, severe myasthenia, multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, cerebral palsy, quadriplegia or hemiplegia, a primitive brain malignant tumour, progressive cerebellar disease or a rare disease
- Have Down Syndrome 21

This is also the case if you have congenital or acquired immunosuppression:

- Drug (anti-cancer chemotherapy, immunosuppressive treatment, biotherapy and/or immunosuppressive dose corticotherapy)
- Uncontrolled or CD4 HIV infection < 200/mm³
- Consecutive to a solid organ or hematopoietic stem cell transplant
- Linked to malignant hemopathy being treated.

This is also the case if you are severely immunocompromised because you are in one of the following situations:

- Receiving a transplant of hematopoietic organ or stem cells
- Under lymphocytic chemotherapy
- Be treated with strong immunosuppressive drugs, such as antimetabolites (cellcept, myfortic, mycophenolate mofetil, imurel, azathioprine) and AntiCD20 (rituximab: Mabthera, Rixathon, Truxima)
- On a case-by-case basis, if you are under immunosuppressants of another class or have a primitive acquired immune deficiency
- Be chronic dialysis, after your GP has given advice on the need for appropriate examinations

The enhanced protection measures that may justify partial unemployment are:

- Isolation of the workstation, in particular by making available an individual office or, if this is not possible, by setting up your office to minimise the risk of exposure, in particular by adapting your schedules or by putting in place material protection
- Respect, in the workplace and in any place frequented during your professional activity, of reinforced barrier gestures: improved hand hygiene, routine use of a surgical mask if physical distancing cannot be respected or in a closed environment, with the mask changing at least every 4 hours and before this time, if wet or wet
- No or limited workstation sharing
- Cleaning and disinfecting your workstation and surfaces that you touch at least at the beginning and at the end of the workstation, especially if this workstation is shared
- Adapt arrival and departure times and any other business trips, taking into account the means of transport you use, to avoid busy times
- Provision by your employer of surgical masks sufficient to cover the journeys between home and work if you use public transportation

If your employer feels that your partial unemployment claim is not justified because they feel that your position does not expose you to high viral densities, they refer it to the occupational physician.

The occupational physician will decide whether or not you are exposed to high viral densities and on the implementation of protective measures.

Pending the opinion of the occupational physician, you are placed in partial unemployment.

You are the contact

If you have been in contact with a person tested positive at Covid-19, the instructions are the same whether you lived with the positive person or not.

However, they vary depending on whether you have a [full vaccination scheme](https://solidarites-sante.gouv.fr/grands-dossiers/vaccin-covid-19/je-suis-un-particulier/dose-de-rappel-covid19) or not: the [segregation and screening rules](https://www.ameli.fr/assure/actualites/covid-19-les-regles-d-isolement-evoluent) are not the same.

If you are asymptomatic and if telework is not possible during your isolation, you must register on the Health Insurance website.

This allows you to benefit from a work stoppage and a quasi-full replacement of your salary during this stoppage. Daily allowances and employer's allowance are paid to you without waiting period or conditions for the opening of the right.

You're back from a move to the foreigner

If you have travelled (business or personal) to the foreigner, [conditions of your return to France \[application/pdf - 550.1 KB\]](https://www.interieur.gouv.fr/sites/minint/files/medias/documents/2022-01/dossier-de-presse-voyages-depuis-et-vers-l-etranger-au-14-janvier.pdf) vary depending on the health situation of the country you have stayed in and your vaccination situation.

You must keep your child

If you do not telework, you may be placed on partial unemployment in the following situations:

- You are the parent of a child under the age of 16 whose custody is required due to the closure of the nursery, school or college
- Your child under 16 is identified as *case-contact* a person infected with the virus
- You are a parent of a disabled child who is subject to an isolation, eviction or home support measure

Only 1 of the parents can benefit from partial unemployment.

This compensation is granted on condition that the 2 parents are not able to telework and on presentation of proof of the closure of the class or of the child's case-contact or of the measure of isolation of the disabled child.

If neither parent can be placed on partial unemployment, one of the parents is placed in a work stoppage. You must register on the Health Insurance website.

The daily allowances and the employer supplement are then paid to you, without waiting period or conditions for the opening of the right, until your child returns to nursery school or college.

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You are positive at Covid-19

If you have tested positive on covid-19, you must isolate yourself and perform an antigenic (Tag) or RT-PCR test during this isolation period.

 **Please note** : to ensure continuity of care in the health and medico-social sector, you can be exempted from isolation if you are asymptomatic or not symptomatic. If you are concerned, get closer to your employer establishment.

Your [isolation conditions](https://www.ameli.fr/assure/actualites/covid-19-les-regles-d-isolement-evoluent) vary depending on you have [full vaccination scheme](https://solidarites-sante.gouv.fr/grands-dossiers/vaccin-covid-19/je-suis-un-particulier/dose-de-rappel-covid19) or not. The duration of the isolation period before the test is performed and then the duration of the isolation period depending on whether the test is positive or negative are not the same.

If you need a work stoppage, you must register on the Health Insurance website.

You get a near-full replacement of your salary during your shutdown.

Daily allowances and employer's allowance are paid to you without waiting period or conditions for the opening of the right.

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You are a public servant

Telework or Present

You telework at least 3 days a week if your job allows it.

As of 2 February 2022, the use of teleworking will no longer be mandatory but will remain recommended.

Your administration must implement the measures set out in [national protocol to ensure the health and safety of employees in company \[application/pdf - 1.0 MB\]](https://travail-emploi.gouv.fr/IMG/pdf/protocole-nationale-sante-securite-en-entreprise.pdf)  (<https://travail-emploi.gouv.fr/IMG/pdf/protocole-nationale-sante-securite-en-entreprise.pdf>).

Protective measures are issued by your administration via a memorandum.

A Covid-19 reference is designated. It shall ensure that the measures defined are implemented and that officers are informed. Its identity and mission shall be communicated to all staff.

Vaccine Pass Required

What is the vaccine pass?

Depending on your activity, you must have one of the following documents:

Which professionals are involved?

The agents subject to the vaccination pass are those carrying out the following activities:

- Transport of persons
- Cultural, sports, fun or festive activities
- Commercial catering or drinks (except catering, take-away of prepared meals)
- Health, Social and Medico-Social Services and Facilities

If your position is affected by the obligation to pass the vaccine, you are not in possession of one of these documents and you do not choose, in agreement with your administration, to leave, you are suspended from your duties. You're no longer paid. This suspension ends as soon as you present one of these 3 supporting documents.

Vaccination required

Health care professionals must be vaccinated against Covid-19, except for medical certificates of contraindication.

You are concerned if you work in one of the following establishments:

- Public Health Facility (and Army Hospital)
- Health Centre
- Health home
- Mobile Care Centre and Team
- Medical Centre and Armed Forces Health Service Mobile Care Team
- Support mechanism for the coordination of health pathways
- Tuberculosis Control Centre
- Free centre for information, screening and diagnosis of human immunodeficiency virus, viral hepatitis and sexually transmitted infections
- University Health Service
- Occupational Health Service
- Establishment and social and medico-social service (Ehpad (), Ase (), etc.)
- Housing
- Residence-services for the elderly or disabled
- Inclusive Habitat

You are also affected if you do any of the following:

- Home Care Worker
- Fire brigade and fire brigade, pilot and flight crew of civil security, military of civil security units

You must have one of the following 3 documents to continue working:

- Proof that you received 2 doses of vaccine
- Certificate of Recovery from Covid-19 Contamination Issued on Presentation of a Positive Test for RT-PCR or an Antigenic Test More Than 11 Days Old and Less Than 6 Months Old
- Medical Certificate of Vaccine Counterindication

You must give your employer or your occupational physician proof of your situation.

If you do not have one of the required documents, your employer will inform you without delay of your prohibition and of the means to regularise your situation. With the agreement of your employer, you can take leave. Otherwise, your employment contract is suspended and you are no longer paid.

The contract suspension ends as soon as you provide one of the required documents.

The period of suspension of your employment contract is not considered an effective period of work for the calculation of your leave entitlements. It is not taken into account in the calculation of your seniority and the resulting rights.

During this suspension, you retain the benefit of the additional social protection guarantees you have subscribed to.

If you CDD (), your contract expires on the scheduled date if it occurs during the suspension period.

You are considered vulnerable

- Sufficient numbers of surgical-type masks are provided by your employer to cover commuting between home and work if you use public transportation.

If your employer feels that your request for a special leave of absence is not justified because it considers that your position does not expose you to high viral densities, it will refer the matter to the occupational physician.

The occupational physician will decide whether or not you are exposed to high viral densities and on the implementation of protective measures.

Pending the opinion of the occupational physician, you are placed under special leave of absence (Asa).

You are the contact

If you have been in contact with a person tested positive in covid-19, the instructions are the same whether you lived with the positive person or not.

However, they vary depending on whether you have a [full vaccination scheme](https://solidarites-sante.gouv.fr/grands-dossiers/vaccin-covid-19/je-suis-un-particulier/dose-de-rappel-covid19) or not: the [segregation and screening rules](https://www.ameli.fr/assure/actualites/covid-19-les-regles-d-isolement-evoluent) are not the same.

This allows you to be placed in a special absence permit (Asa).

You're back from a move to the foreigner

You must keep your child

You are a civil servant

If you do not telework, you may be placed under a Special Leave of Absence (Asa) if you are a parent of a child under 16 years of age whose custody is required due to the closure of the nursery, school or college.

You can also be placed in Asa if your child is identified as *case-contact* a person infected with the virus.

Only 1 parent can be placed in Asa.

Placement in Asa is granted on condition that the 2 parents cannot telework and on presentation of a proof of closure of the class or the child's case-contact situation.

You're contractual

If you do not telework, you can be put in a work stoppage in the following situations:

- You are the parent of a child under the age of 16 whose custody is required due to the closure of the nursery, school or college
- Your child under 16 is identified as *case-contact* a person infected with the virus
- You are a parent of a disabled child who is subject to an isolation, eviction or home support measure.

You must register on the Health Insurance website.

Only 1 parent can have a work stoppage.

This work stoppage is granted on condition that the 2 parents cannot telework and on presentation of a proof of the closure of the class or of the child's case-contact or of the measure of isolation of the disabled child.

Daily allowances are paid to you without waiting period or conditions for the opening of the right, until your child returns to nursery school or college.

You are positive at Covid-19
